Evolution of the Internet

- Expansion of computer networks
 - Military applications
 - University research applications
 - Commercial applications

Internet Defined

Interconnection of existing computer networks using conventions for exchanging information.

Intranet Defined

Interconnection of limited access computer networks within one organization

Internet Features

- Bulletin board systems (Usenet Newsgroups)
- List servers (Mailing Lists)
- Electronic mail (E-mail)
- File transfer protocols (FTP)
- Chat
- Computer conferencing

Internet Features

- World-Wide Web (WWW)
- WWW home page (Splash Page)
- WWW web site
- Browser
- Search engine
- Links

Use of the Internet

- Identify problems and possibilities, e.g., surfing serendipity
- Search for information to solve a problem
- Obtain information when users know what they want
- Communicate with others

Identify Problems and Possibilities

- Surfing the Internet using the term "career" and becoming aware of new work options
- Reading exchanges on a usenet newsgroup and becoming aware of emerging occupations

Search for Information

- Links to career services via gateway sites or individual sites (e.g., Parachute)
- Reference information sources

 (e.g., Career INFONet, Parachute, Riley Guide)
- Occupations that match specific interests and skills (e.g., CACG system files)

Search for Information

- Networking opportunities (e.g., directories, usenet newsgroups, mailing lists, Riley Guide)
- Employers by occupation (e.g., Parachute, Riley Guide)
- Job openings by occupation and geographic region (e.g., AJB)
- Potential employees by occupation (e.g. ATB)

Obtain Information

- Occupations (e.g., OOH web site, ACI-Net, professional association web sites, Riley Guide, Parachute, special interest group mailing list)
- Educational institutions (e.g., institutional web sites, Riley Guide, Parachute)
- Wages (e.g., AJB, Parachute, Riley Guide)

Obtain Information

- Employment outlook (e.g., Bureau of Labor Statistics web site, AJB, Riley Guide, Parachute, employer web sites)
- Special population information (e.g., Parachute)
- Professional associations by occupation (e.g., directories, Riley Guide)

Obtain Information

- Individual information (e.g., directories)
- Employers (e.g., AJB, employer web sites, Parachute, Riley Guide, special interest group mailing list)
- Job search strategies (e.g. Riley Guide, service provider web sites)
- Content & process of resume writing (e.g. service provider web sites)

Communicate With Others

- E-mail an information request to a networking contact
- E-mail scheduling of an information interview
- Chat with a networking contact

Communicate With Others

- Post a resume on a talent bank
- E-mail or FTP a cover letter and resume to an employer
- E-mail or FTP thank you letters

Effective Internet Use

- Effective when used as one of several resources
- Most valuable for information and networking
- Evaluate sites in terms of needs
- Think use reflect network reflect - use - reflect - network...

Potential Internet Problems

- Relying too much on the Internet
- Being overwhelmed with web sites or information
- Becoming sidetracked when surfing

Potential Internet Problems

- Unethical (Incompetence or fraud)
- Out-of-date information
- Bad information
- Disclosure of personal information

Potential Internet Problems

- Slow response time (WWW - World Wide Wait)
 - Time of day
 - Local server limitations
 - Remote server limitations

Potential Integration Benefits

- Using PC-based software to help avoid inappropriate Internet use
 - embedded links in computer-assisted career guidance systems
- Using a career center web site to provide links to web sites
