## Transitioning from Military to Civilian Employment

For those who have worked within the U.S. Armed Services, obtaining employment in the civilian world may be an unfamilliar challenge. The resources and activities below are designated to help ease this transition for veterans.

## **Objectives**

- 1. To identify skills which may be transferred from military service to civilian employment.
- 2. To locate civilian occupations which utilize similar skills and knowledge.
- 3. To describe military experience in civilian terminology on a resume or in correspondence.
- 4. To identify transitional issues that may accompany the career change.
